

#### Message from Music Director **Stephen Robb**

Our 2023-2024 season has become a pivotal moment in our history. After more than five years of work, we leaped forward in our 2023-2024 season to invest in a professional management staff for the RDYO for the first time in its history to manage and direct the day-to-day orchestra operations.

Our youth orchestra program continues to grow and prosper. Our organization has experienced incredible growth over the past five years. I credit this to the professional way our board and musical staff negotiated the Covid years; moving the whole orchestral training process online and finding new creative ways to teach and communicate with our orchestra members and families. Through virtual training, virtual rehearsals, live recording sessions inperson, and then returning gradually to socially distanced safe rehearsal practices, we achieved what many other youth orchestras were unable to achieve. This process culminated in our 50th anniversary celebration concert at the Chan Centre in May 2022.

After the success of 2021-2022, our 2022-2023 season became a challenge as we faced the closure of our main rehearsal space at Brighouse United Church, and we faced unprecedented uncertainty as we ended our concert season with our final awards concert at Gateway Theatre in May 2023 without knowing where the orchestra would be rehearsing the following season. It was not until the beginning of August 2023 that we secured new rehearsal space for our 2023 – 2024 season.

Indeed, the largest challenge facing RDYO as we move forward is securing more appropriate storage and rehearsal spaces in order to conduct our orchestral programs better. This basic insecurity has impeded our orchestra operations and our delivery of services and caused many hours of administrative time to be consumed with unnecessary attention to logistics simply due to the lack of basic rehearsal spaces that meet our needs. An example would be calculating how many hours were spent securing timpani drums for our Junior Strings, Wind Ensemble and Symphony performances during the past few months. During the Covid years when these restrictions were removed, we enjoyed a more even playing field with the other youth orchestras in our province as we are all restricted from using proper facilities.

In 2023- 2024 we produced our regular season of five concerts including the November Rotary Fundraiser Concert, our December all-division concert, our March Strings concert, our April Winds and Symphony concert, and finally our Year-end Awards Concert on June 1st. This is augmented by other regular season events such as our Fall Orchestra Camp at Camp Stillwood, our Winter Workshop in February and our Junior String Workshop in March. We also conducted our Annual Concerto Competition and Scholarship Competitions (December and April).

Congratulations to our board of directors, faculty, all families and our admin team for a very successful year. I look forward to our 2024-2025 season.



## Programming Highlights

#### Rehearsals

Over the course of nine months, we held more than **232** rehearsals, offering our youth extensive practice time guided by our esteemed faculty. This allows them not only the opportunity to expand their musical horizons through learning new repertoire selections, but also encourages them to be engaged and inspired through valuable exchanges with fellow musicians.

#### Orchestral Development Camp (6-8th October, 2023)

This year, our three-day, two-night camp at Camp Stillwood in Abbotsford brought together over 100 students, offering them an immersive and unforgettable experience. Positioned strategically at the start of the season, the camp provided youth with a special opportunity to build meaningful connections with their fellow musicians. At the camp, students engaged in more intensive rehearsals, enjoyed captivating performance by our faculty, and participated in a variety of team-building activities and games. The camp concluded with a concert. Beyond honing musical skills, our camp aimed to cultivate a sense of unity and teamwork among our musicians.

#### Annual Concerto Competition (3rd December, 2023)

40 applicants participated in our annual concerto competition. We are honored to have Mr. Eric Wilson as our adjudicator. Following a day of musical performances, we had a total of 5 winners, one from Junior Strings, Intermediate Strings, Senior Strings, Senior Winds and Symphony. These winners are showcased as soloists in our concerts later in the season.



#### Annual Scholarship Competition (1st - 27th April, 2024)

Over 70 applicants participated in the annual scholarship competition, which this year took the form of online video submissions. We were privileged to have experienced adjudicators Mr. Jacob van der Sloot, Mr. Jasper Wood, and Mr. Mark McGreggor lending their expertise. Thanks to the generous support of our donors and sponsors, we were able to give out 26 awards to deserving recipients.

#### Workshops

In Spring 2024, Richmond Delta Youth Orchestra organized two days of workshops, featuring eight professional clinicians who conducted masterclasses with our talented musicians. These workshops provided invaluable opportunities for our students to receive guidance and feedback on their performance. In addition to the enriching masterclasses, the workshop days also included pizza lunches, fostering a relaxed and friendly atmosphere where students could bond and socialize with each other.



#### Financial Overview



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RDYO's expenses for 2023-2024 has increased by **30**% due to rising costs, the move to a new location, the need for storage as well as the strategic plan to invest in operational structure.

Our **revenue** has also increased with **16% more funding** from the provincial & municipal grants, however, following Canadians' declined giving trends, our **donations** has significantly decreased.

RDYO is well prepared for this period of growth and investment in its sustainability. We continue to work hard on **cutting cost** while maintaining the **best possible learning environment** for students, **equitable pay** for staff and faculty, and striving to establish new partnership, sponsorship and fundraising campaign.

We thank all of our parents, donors, partners, funders, sponsors and volunteers for making this season a reality! We look forward to the 2024-2025 season with renewed hope as we were awarded an important **BC Arts Council** grant to research and plan for a potential new home.
